City Council Approves "Self-Certification"

A legislative package strengthening the regulation of New York City's building project "self certification" program was passed yesterday by the City Council Sponsored by Council Member James Vacca et. al.

The first measure would allow the City to sanction architects and engineers who falsely certify that building permit application plans are compliant with the building code and zoning restrictions (Int. No. 309-A). Specifically, the City would be

allowed to rescind the self-certification privileges of architects or engineers who knowingly or negligently certified an application or plan that contained false information or did not comply with all applicable laws. In addition, self-certification privileges could be rescinded if an architect or engineer has submitted two professionally certified applications within any twelve month period that either led to revocation of a permit or otherwise demonstrated incompetence or a lack of knowledge of applicable laws

The second bill, requires the Department of Buildings to review all plans certified by an architect or engineer who has been placed on probation by the state (Int. No. 308-A).

Both bills now go to Mayor Michael Bloomberg for consideration.

Mathcounts 2007

The Queens Chapter - NYSSPE held its annual MATHCOUNTS Competition on Saturday, February 10th, at JHS 189, Flushing. Thirteen schools from Queens registered in the MATHCOUNTS Program competed in the competition. One school, for religious reasons, competed earlier in the week. MATHCOUNTS is a Math skills building and competition for 6th, 7th & 8th grade students, sponsored by the National Society of Professional Engineers, the CNA Foundation and the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. Competitions are held at the local Chapter level, followed by a State competition. The top individuals from the State competition then compete at the National Competition, which is being held in Fort Worth, TX this year. The top winners of the National Competition can win college scholarships.

Teams of 4 students and up to 4 individuals from the schools spent about 3 hours taking various written and oral tests. There was a 40 minute, 30 question written individual test, followed by four sets of two written questions to be answered in 6 minutes
